OPENING: The meeting was called to order at 7:03 pm by President Sondra Leidesdorff with 27 members present. An introduction of the PTAC Board was given.

Motion: Approve Anne Jentz for the office of Communications for the 2013-2014 school year. Motion approved.

The Pledge of Allegiance was recited. The minutes of the May 2013 meeting were approved as posted.

SPECIAL PRESENTATION: Presented by Lisa Granat, Grass Roots St. Vrain

Lisa gave a short history of Grass Roots St. Vrain. She then shared a video about the funding of schools in Colorado. Colorado is unique as the voters determine funding. Introduced Debbie Lammers from the SVVSD Board of Education.

Amendment 66

- Will be on the ballot this November
- A statewide initiative
- Would be a tax increase (in 2 tiers depending on income)
- Would restore the tax rate back to the rate it was in the 90s (for one of the tiers)
- Colorado is in the bottom 10 of state funding for education in the nation
- There are more students in Colorado now but funding has not increased
- If passed, would provide about \$25 million for St. Vrain

PRINCIPAL'S REPORT: Presented by Nancy Pitz

Touched on issues that have been brought up to her:

Flood Victims

- Community really stepped up - thank you!
- Effect on School Calendar: not sure yet what will be done about the days missed, there are conversations happening at the state level because 33 school districts were impacted by the flood; Will let us know as soon as she knows something

Save the Date

- November 14, 6:00, PTAC meeting will include the Parent Update given by the Principal, basically a big picture of Niwot Elementary

Class Size

- FTE (Full Time Employee): Student enrollment is predicted in the Spring for the following school year (FTE is based on this number); they predicted we would be at 457 and we are at 468 (502 with preschool)
- Since we are close to what the district predicted we will not receive any more FTE for another teacher (may be able to fund paras a little more)
- Class sizes:
 - K - 24
 - 1st - 24
 - 2nd - 27
 - 3rd - 26
 - 4th - 26
 - 5th - 30
- We are fortunate our PTAC is able to fund our paras: 3 hour para at each grade level (1st-5th) is funded through Round-Up; FTE from the school gave additional paras to 2nd and 5th (due to class sizes) for a total of 4 hours
- October count for the state is going on now; the state bases the amount of funding districts get on this number

Technology

- Over the years our school has received so much technology (from PTAC primarily), this year we are focusing on Professional Development to train teachers in using that technology in the classroom
- At our next late start we will be having two people from the district coming to work with the staff on how to use technology to meet our standards

TEACHER'S REPORT: Presented by Jenna Olschlager

Music

I have a student teacher this fall from August to mid October. Mr. Rose is a student at CSU, and will be teaching middle school band from October –December. I'm excited for him to share drumming since he is a percussionist at CSU.

1st Grade

Mr. Peterson and Mrs. Calkins are grateful for our grade level paraprofessional funded with PTAC funds. We use our paraprofessional to meet with individual students needing help, leading groups working on math facts, and providing extra challenge to students who need it. PTAC funds have also been used to purchase leveled book bins, phonics board games, iPads, and iTouches for classroom use. We can do more, and do it better, because of the generosity of this community channeled through our amazing PTAC!

Literacy

The funds that are allocated to the Literacy Room are teacher grants.

I use the money for books, magazines, on line reading programs and rewards for home reading.

This money is very useful so I can get many types of reading in front of children.

Miss Rogers

PTAC purchased two additional laptops for me, so that my students would be able to do more research. It has been such a help! I would wish for more, since we do a lot of research and writing, but I'm very thankful for the 4 laptops I have!

4th Grade

4th Grade uses the paraprofessionals for a Small supported group in Reading. Each teacher sends two students two Mrs. Olsen. This replaces Mrs. Gilson's support, as we do not get her this year due to all the testing changes! This group sees her 5 days a week. She will be working on the classroom curriculum, but in a smaller setting. She will also be using books, both non-fiction and fiction to practice reading comprehension strategies. They will discuss the books they are reading as a group, which helps increase comprehension. Mrs. Burke will be working with a Boy group in Writing, this will give them more support as well as interest based writing.

I Personally used most of my teacher grant money already on classroom supplies, workbooks, markers, glue sticks, sharpies, pens, sticky notes, etc. etc.

We also have Mrs. Olsen's support for math - she works daily with Mrs. Horne to help provide extra support to the grade-level curriculum.

I also spend a portion on supplies and was able purchase Brain Pop for the 4th and 5th grade teachers to use

Technology is in use DAILY! Such a boon to differentiating for students

Report from Cyndi Summers, 5th grade teacher

- We are able to do what we do because of your support!
- What we appreciate the most is the paras: This school attracts certified teachers for para positions.
- Shared a little of what paras do in 5th grade: writing groups, help with struggling readers
- Uses of grants for teachers in 5th grade: Colonial craft day, science fair posters, Young Ameritowne, field day shirts, assemblies to extend what we are learning about and filling holes not in the curriculum
- Thank you for all the support you give teachers

Round Up Committee Overview: Presented by Stacey Bahr and Susan Rona

What is Round Up?:

- PTAC funds a lot, every April the board presents a budget in April and then is voted on in May
- It is our fundraiser to fund the projected budget
- \$51,000 of our \$89,000 budget goes towards paras
- We do Round Up so we are not out selling (wrapping paper, cookie dough, magazines, etc.)
- We are asking for a donation of \$225 and you can "round up" to \$300 if you have more than one child at Niwot Elementary (but encouraged to give any amount)
- We are pushing for participation from every family, at any amount

The Committee is made up of Susan Rona, Stacey Bahr and Julie Rich. You can go through the expense lines in the budget to see exactly where the money is going. We are sensitive to what is going on in our community due to the flood but feel it is critical to continue to support our school. Since we fund our paras, we make a commitment to the district that we will pay for them, this is why we have a deadline for Round Up to end.

We are also having a contest, Fill the Boot, where each grade level will be tracked for class participation with the winning grade winning a popsicle recess, 5th grade is in the lead right now. Check with your employer to see if they do Corporate Match. Cowboy day will be October 4th. We take check or credit card online. We are at 25% participation right now.

TREASURER'S REPORT: Presented by Jennifer Wilby

Financials were presented and reviewed. (See slideshow at beginning of minutes)

It is OUR budget, not the board's budget. The budget was presented in April and voted on and approved in May. There will be changes throughout the year as it is hard to predict so far in advance. We want to be transparent.

As a nonprofit, we can't go into debt so we are conscience of our cash flow. The figures are available to view on the PTAC website.

Reviewed Surplus expenditures (slide in slideshow)

Budget: \$89,000

- 57% comes from Round-Up and Corporate Match
- 20% comes from activities and events
- 23% comes from corporate cash

Where it goes:

- 54% to paras
- 24% to teacher support
- 13% to school support

- 3% to library
- 3% to facilities support
- 3% to operating expenses

New CVR forms were printed and sent home to any parents that we had not received forms from over this past week. The forms were requested to be returned to the front office by Friday, Sept 27th. Due to unanticipated school closures, the collection and delivery of the student/parent contact information will be delayed. A quality audit of the collected data will hopefully take place the first week of October allowing a delivery of final directory contents by early to mid October. Delays in the school district providing the reports we need to generate the directory contents may delay this final content delivery further into October.

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We currently have 40 sponsors submitting advertisements to be included in the NES 2013-2014 Directory. 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This year the Greenstar committee is going to continue our classroom glue brigade collection programs. This includes collecting ALL glue sticks, caps, glue bottles and caps from all classrooms pre-K through 5th. Collection boxes will be placed in classrooms within the next week or two. Last year we were able to save 642 glue sticks from ending up in landfills and I'm hoping we can reach 700 this year!

Along with the glue brigade, we have also started a juice pouch brigade in the cafeteria. 1. The parking lot traffic pattern has been altered to allow for a better flow.
2. The kiss and catch lane is now one side only.
3. A new gate has been installed to restrict traffic into the bus area
4. A new fence will be permanently installed at the center of the kiss and catch lane.
5. New signage was installed in the parking lot.
6. Designated staff parking has been allocated.

All of these changes were made in cooperation with the St Vrain district transportation and engineering departments. There was NO money spent from Niwot Elementary's budgets.

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CLASSROOM PRESENTATIONS TO BEGIN SOON

On October 22, 23, and 24, Mr. Peterson and Mwebaza Foundation Development Assistant, Devaki Douillard, will be visiting classrooms to give students an update on their Ugandan pen pals. Students will receive letters and photos from their pen pals, and will be shown photos and videos of life at Niwot's African partner school, Mwebaza School. Children will learn about the progress of the construction of a new middle school that is being built for Mwebaza students using funds raised by families here at Niwot. Mr. Peterson and Ms. Douillard visited Mwebaza School last summer, along with Niwot's own music teacher, Miss. O, and a team of four others.

CONSTRUCTION PROGRESS

The Mwebaza Foundation is currently helping to build two schools in Uganda – a middle school for students at Mwebaza School, and a primary school for children in the village of Nkokonjeru. Both buildings were designed by Niwot architect, Amanda Woodward, and her husband, solar engineer, John Tembrock. The foundation of each building has been completed, and walls are starting to go up! Waterless, self-composting toilets have been installed in concrete bases, and the buildings surrounding these units will be constructed soon. We estimate that building construction will be completed early next year, and we plan to install solar panels in late winter or spring. Both new schools will collect rainwater from their roofs. This rainwater will be sterilized using units donated by the TankPro Corporation of Australia. Such units are currently used at Mwebaza School. *In the photo to the left, Mwebaza students are washing their hands using collected, purified rainwater.*

Thanks to Niwot families for helping make these new school buildings a reality for some wonderful children in east Africa!
